Motion was made by Mr. Brotherton seconded by Mr. Benton, to adopt the minutes of the March 15, 2023, board meeting.


The President called for public comment. There being none, votes were cast and the motion carried unanimously.

Branch Circulation Statistics March 2023

Karen Hinson, Aulds Branch Manager, reported recent Saturday patron counts to the Board.

Due to low numbers and expenses with staffing, the Board voted for Aulds to remain closed on Saturdays.

Teresa Rice, Associate Director of Technical Services, presented a review of activity in March, 2023. The material budget is 45% spent and 2,289 items were added, averaging 100 items processed daily.

Annie Gilmer, Community Outreach Librarian, gave an overview of some recent developments. She demonstrated for the Board how an Orcam reads aloud for visually impaired individuals. The Association for the Blind donated two to the library that will be available for in-house use at two branches. For the Day of Caring by the United Way of NWLA the Benton Branch will get a learning trail painted around the building. The Summer Reading Experience 2023 is for all ages will be launched soon, with many generous local sponsors giving away coupons to readers who meet their goals. Annie delivers reading materials monthly to homebound patrons who are unable to go to the library, and also explained how printing from mobile devices from home to the library assists those who don't own printers.

Community Impacts: Clara Anne Madison shared notes of appreciation managers at two branches received. A Central patron who suffered from hearing loss received a cochlear implant and now is enjoying listening to audiobooks. She stated that listening to her first book "brought her to tears."

An East80 patron wrote a note of thanks praising the wonderful job the manager, Tanika Johnson, and her staff are doing to engage the local community.

March 2023 Statements for Operating and Construction Funds: Director Felesha Sweeney presented the March 2023 Statements for Operating and Construction Funds. Revenue for the Operating Budget is \$8,185,891.54. Expenditures are \$1,834,059.29. The Ending Fund Balance is \$9,721,907.00. Motion to approve the Operating Budget was made by Mr. Benton and seconded by Mr. Brotherton. Motion carried unanimously.

The Construction Budget Beginning Fund Balance is \$7,193,749.82. Expenditures are \$1,499,833.09. Ending Fund Balance is \$5,767,400.09.

Motion to approve the Construction Budget was made by Ms. Parks and seconded by Mr. Benton. Motion carried unanimously.

Felesha Sweeney presented the Director's Report.

She congratulated Annie Gilmer, for the honor of being a finalist in the United Way Community Hero Award.

Felesha proposed that annual Staff Day be held on October 9, 2023, 9am -4pm, with charges waived

at the Louisiana Tech Academic Success Center on East Texas Street. The Police Jury agreed to supply the food for the annual training day.

Motion to approve holding Staff Day in 2023 on October 9th at the Louisiana Tech Academic Success Center was made by Mr. Benton and seconded by Ms. Parks. Motion carried unanimously.

Revisions to Registration Policy: When the library goes cashless, free print allowances up to 20 pages will be given to Adults, Child/Teen, and e-card users. Motion made by Mr. Benton and seconded by Mr. Brotherton to approve the revisions to the Registration Policy. Motion carried unanimously.

Revisions to Lending Policy: Fee increases were recommended for some photocopies. The price of color copies to 40 cents and oversize copies, \$1.00.

Motion made by Mr. Benton and seconded by Ms. Parks. Motion carried unanimously.

Proposed Changes for Benton: Metra Ardoin, Branch Manager, requested that Benton be open an extra hour Monday through Thursday, 9 am-7pm to better serve the busy Benton community. Friday and Saturday hours will remain unchanged.

Motion by Mr. Brotherton and seconded by Ms. Parks to extend the closing time Monday – Thursday to 7 pm. Motion carried unanimously.

A part-time, 16-hour, position is necessary to staff the extended evening hours.

Motion to approve the new part-time position made by Ms. Parks and seconded by Mr. Brotherton. Motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business to come before the Library Board of Control regular and legal session on this 19th day of April, 2023, meeting was adjourned at 12:09 p.m.
